Spousal assault rates against Aboriginal women are almost higher than those against

non-Aboriginal women

69%

of victims said they did not report a domestic violence incident to police.

40%

of Indigenous respondents said they were physically or sexually abused as children. That was far more than the 29 per cent of non-indigenous people who reported family violence.

340/ of Aboriginal women said that a current or former partner had been emotionally or financially abusive towards them in the 5 years preceding the survey, almost double that of non-Aboriginal women (17%).

of indigenous respondents said they were victims of spousal violence in 2014. That's more than double the number of non-indigenous people (4%) who reported family violence in those years.

Aboriginal women are more likely to experience severe or life-threatening family violence than non-Aboriginal women
